Mexico 2016

This is the official announcement of the club salt water trips to Mexico. There are two trips planned for 2016.

Xcalak

Grab your suntan lotion and big boy rods for a week of flats or inshore saltwater fly fishing in old Mexico.

The first trip is April 30 thru March 7 in the small-town of Xcalak on the Yucatan Peninsula. Using 8wt rods, we will hook up with lots of bone fish and have shots at permit, tarpon, barracuda and snook. I am always surprised at how strong a 18" bone fish is , taking you well into your backing , two or three times before you get him to the boat. Fish from a boat or stalk them walking barefoot on sugar white sand.

There are two more spots left for this all inclusive trip, plus air and transport. Time is of the essence as I need to secure the lodge room and guides. \$2350.00

La Ventana, Punta Arena

The second trip is inshore fishing at La Ventana, Punta Arena near La Paz, Baja Calif. Sept.17 - 24th. Fishing out of pangas there are a wide variety of spices to choose from. Dorado, roosters, skipjack, jacks, tuna, pargo, snapper, pompano, trigger, sailfish, etc......

This all inclusive trip is hosted by Gary Bulla who has years of experience.


The Tier's Bench:
